How many of us mere mortals, blessed with at best average athletic ability, have actually dreamnt about running with world-class athletes, along a course flanked by an estimated 1 million people and a television audience which outrates Dynasty and Dallas put together? Graham Lane and myself realised this ambition when we competed in this year's London Marathon.

As we made our way to the start in pouring rain and sub-zero temperatures, our only protection against the elements, apart from our tropical weight shorts and singlet was a black dustbin liner with a hole cut out of the top and a supermarket bag covering our heads. Insanity yes - trendy definitely not!

We finally reached a point where we could go no further forwards or for that matter no further backwards. Now there was nothing else to do but wait and soak up the incredible atmosphere that is 'The London'. Many different languages and a full range of British dialects filled the air and produced a magnificent cacophony. All shapes and sizes ranging from an ex world boxing champion to a dwarf shuffled on the spot in a vain attempt to keep warm. It was to be the only time I wished I had worn the gorilla outfit sported by a gentleman just ahead of us. Someone dressed as the the Sugar Plum Fairy was to our left and the oldest competitor 81 year old Pat Riley was somewhere behind us. Then at last after an indeterminable amount of time, Prince Charles, in suitably flamboyant fashion, fired the cannon and we were off amidst an enormous cheer. Well, not exactly off. It took us a couple of minutes before we put one foot in front of the other and at least five before we got into anything resembling a stride. However, we and the 20 000 other starters, were on our way, squelching around the 26 mile course from Greenwich Park through narrow cobbled streets, around the Tower of London and onto the finish overlooked by Big Ben and the Houses of Parliament.

People in the streets up to ten deep, dispensing orange slices, cups of tea, boiled sweets, even beer and wine, shouting support and urging you on. Music also abounds and a variety of different bands playing numbers such as "Keep right on to the end of the road" prevent the weary legs from failing completely.

As I staggered over the line, a total wreck, having hit the wall at about twenty miles, a foil space-blanket was thrown over me, a medal placed around my neck and a kiss firmly planted on my cheek by some poor unfortunate female. What a thought, kissing 20 000 sweaty males who were without doubt not looking their best!

It was only after I had collected my gear, drank copious quantities of water and slowly headed towards the Post-Run Reception, where beer and sandwiches awaited us, that I realised that those last few hours were an experience that I will never forget. The fact that I had not run up to my expactations didn't matter, the loss of my big toenail was even less important. What was important was that I had just completed in one of the major highlights of the British sporting calender, that had been superbly organised and that had had an atmosphere that in crowd participation alone would have ranked with the Olympics.

The statistics of the race seemed secondary. Toshikiko Seko of Japan won in 2 hours 10.02 seconds. Graham finished in 3 hours 22 and I stumbled over the line a few minutes later. Possibly the most remarkable performance was a 70 year old who finished in 3 hours 11 minutes.

For anybody intending to compete in a future London Marathon, I will be only too pleased to pass on my enthusiasm. I feel if there is one event that all us joggers, athletes or whatever we like to call ourselves should participate in at least once, it has to be "The London".

CROSS COUNTRY

This run was originally advertised a cross country run, to be held over the National Championship course at Perry Lake.

In the 5k, Barry Harwood finished 1st man with Joyce Sarger 1st woman.
