Try for H/cap Trophy!

SOME changes to our handicap programme were agreed at the 2010 AGM and they have now been settled.

To encourage more members to compete for the Handicap Trophy, some shorter runs have been included. So, at the following events it will be the short run, rather than the 10km, that becomes the handicap event.

They are Sharks (5km), Woodman Point (5km) and Canning Caper (6km). The longer distance will still be run, of course, but will NOT be a handicap.

Other handicap runs are unchanged, so at Aquinas, Cliff Bould, East Perth and 10km Track Handicap, the long run remains the handicap event.

You will notice on the programme that where the shorter run is the handicap event, the code will show, for instance H (5km). Criteria for awarding the Handicap Trophy are unchanged.

70 years on – Arthur will return to Crete

any similar attacks elsewhere, bemoaning the loss of almost 4500 elite paratroopers.

Arthur Leggett, then in his early 20s, was one of the Aussies who fought in the defence of Greece. Now he has been chosen to represent Australia in a party of six that will travel back to go to Greece to mark the invasion of 70 years ago.

In his biography, Arthur writes movingly of the battle for Crete, and the mates he lost. His regiment – 2/11th Battalion (City of Perth Regiment) lost 53 killed; 126 wounded, and 423 became prisoners-of-war. Arthur was captured and spent the rest of WW2 as a German prisoner.

<u>ROAD WALK</u> <u>CHAMPIONSHIPS</u> Changed to three events

FROM this year, the Road Walking Championship (RWC) will be conducted over three events, rather than four. This will bring it into line with the RRC. Total distance for the RWC will be 30km; for the RRC it's unchanged, at 50km.

We used to have some glorious runs through the bridle tracks in Kings Park, rarely venturing on public footpaths or roads, but now it seems we are destroying the vegetation, putting our lives at risk crossing roads, endangering the public, so we are reduced to the farce of the Teddy Birds Picnic run of running 1.5km up and down a footpath and for that we are charged \$350 (including \$100 litter fee). Instead of enjoying real cross country along the tracks, we have to run on the verge, not allowed to cross roads or run on the side of the road and generally treated like naughty children if we disobey.

Open success a good warm-up for Champs 2011 – another

SEVEN of our athletes tested themselves in the WA Open Championships at the end of the current season, and they came away with ten medals, four of them gold.

Leading the way were our field athletes, and in particular our multi-eventers. Mark Jeffery was the star of the meet with two golds and a bronze.

His first gold came in the pole vault on Saturday, when he equalled Paul Woo's state record of 4.00m - awaiting ratification. Paul set the record some years ago, when he was an active Vets/Masters member.

A bronze followed on the same evening with the discus, behind decathlon colleague Matt Staunton (PBA) who took the silver. Recovery on Sunday morning clearly came quickly with Mark pocketing another gold medal, this time throwing the javelin.

Matt won a medal on each of the three days. He already had a gold from Friday's hammer throw before taking the discus silver. Then on Sunday came a bronze with the shot put.

Byrony Glass, our golden hammer girl, did it again with what was easily her best throw of the season (54.57m). This augurs well for the nationals coming up soon over east.

Graeme Watson is closing the season well. Although below his best in the high jump his 1.60m was good enough for the silver medal, and he took another silver with an 11.30m triple jump. Finally Andrew Brooker pocketed the only MAWA track medal. His 3000m steeplechase time was good enough for third place. Brett Blanco and Melissa Foster performed bravely in extremely competitive events but were not in medal contention.
