The wooden train is a hint to newcomers that our run is part of

the original route of the Eastern Railway. I believe our section of the old track closed in 1966.

It was part of the Eastern Railway's First Route, from Guildford to Chidlow, that opened on March 11, 1884.

The route ascended the escarpment around Greenmount Hill passing through Boya, Darlington, Glen Forrest, Mundaring and Sawyers Valley before turning north to Mount Helena (originally known as White's Mill, then as Lion Mill.)

Older members remember fondly our original 16km run which began at Darlington (where the community hall was great for our lavish morning tea). The run took us 8km uphill through the cutting, and then of course 8km back down again. The return half was exhilarating, generally knocking about five minutes off your uphill time.




