Both records were for 24 hour relay runs. The 40-45 years team

of 10 completed 314.313 kms in the 24 hours — the 35-40 years team com-pleted 353.437 kms in the same time.

"This was a marvellous effort," said Don.

"Tve run in several marathons, and I'd rather do that than compete in a 24 hour relay race.

"THE SUNDAY TIMES" HONOURS OUR CLIFF

For those who don't get "The Sunday Times", we include this feature article by Ray Wilson. It was great to see Cliff receiving recognition in his birthday month, especially as he chalked up another record on February 16 when he completed the Bridges course in 46:45.

CLIFF Bould of Melville has had a lifeti-CLIFF Bould of Melville has had a lifetime's involvement in athletics, and there's still plenty of kick left in the sprightly 69-year-old.

Mr Bould will be one of the upright oldies bounding around McGillivray Oval on March 15-16 during the WA veterans track and field championships.

The former British athletic teams' physiotherapist will win the 70-75 year 10,000m and 5000m events because nobody else in that age bracket will compete.

However, the man who has never tasted alcohol or given his lungs a blackout with cigarette smoke, won't run on his lonesome.

Other athletes in age groups upwards from

35 will compete.

Mr Bould, who turns
70 on March 12, puts in
one-and-a-half hours a
day training to stay in
top condition.

A Pritikin diet — no
fat, salt or sugar —
keeps his insides as fit
as he looks on the out
side.

Along with the legendary veteran athlet
John Gilmour — who
broke a world record in
the 65-70 age group for
the 3000m on Tuesday
night during the club's
weekly meeting — the
quietly spoken English
gentleman — helped
launch veterans athletics in WA in 1972-73.

He held a stopwatch

He held a stopwatch for Roger Bannister at Paddington Recreation Oval in London in 1954 only months before the miler cracked the four-minute barrier.

In 1958 he was the physio for the British team at the Cardiff Commonwealth Games and again acted in that capacity in the Rome Olympics and the Perth Commonwealth Games.

Perhaps his greatest moment of glory came in 1969 during the US Masters track cham-pionships in San Diego.

pionships in San Diego.

Mr Bould, who moved from Melbourne to Perth in 1965, won the six-mile and three-mile runs in world record times for the 50-60 age groups and then came in third in the marathon.

WORLD MASTERS GAMES, TORONTO, CANADA, 1985

When I first read that these Games were to be held I felt that there was no place for them. Some of the 22 sports to be contested had their own World Championships anyway and I confess to feelings of resentment against past Champions, who did not compete in Veterans sport, coming out of retirement to compete. It was great publicity for the Games and for them but who was footing their bills?

Despite being a little 'anti', I was nevertheless delighted to receive an invitation from the Department for Sport and Recreation to hear Maureen and Ken O'Bryan, the prime movers of the Games, address representatives of W.A. sporting groups. The following were the main points made.

- Maureen was the 'ideas' person, Ken the money-man. He raised CAN \$2 million in sponsorship.
- The Games were open to professionals and no National team were permitted. People competed as individuals (evan relay teams were 'drawn out of the hat') and there were no National Anthems or medal counts.
- \$8,300 people from 60 plus countries competed.
- Each seems to have taken at least one other person to Toronto.
- Accommodation costs ranged from nothing (staying with friends and/or relatives) to the best hotels at CAN\$250 per night. People generally made their own ways to venues and socialised of an evening. They spent CAN\$30 million. Economists put a multiplier of three to this, estimating the boost to Toronoto's economy of almost CAN\$100 million.
- The community did not have to bear the cost of providing accommodation, security or facilities (stadia, etc).
- Sports were largely conducted by the senior bodies, many of whom were previously unaware of masters participation in their respective sports. Senior sports concerned had all enjoyed an influx of masters as officials, administrators, coaches, etc since the Games.
- The Games were adjudged to be a great success even though the organising body suffered a financial loss.
- The next Games will be in Denmark in 1989, where a huge increase in numbers (and a profit) are confidently expected.

The Department had invited the Presidents of 110 sporting bodies and representatives of veteran sports to the presentation. The veterans turned up but the 110 were conspicuous by their absences. In view of the beneficial effect of the Games for senior sport in Canada, our senior administrators cannot be seen to be serving the best interests of their particular sports by ignoring the Veterans movement.

Another interesting consideration to arise from the presentation related to the relative costs to the community of staging a major Games. A Masters Games as opposed to Olympic, Commonwealth, etc would have many attractions for a potential host city.

Finally, my reservations disappeared and I wish future Games every success.
