With 4,700 entries this is believed to be the largest track and field event ever held in the world!

As Bob Sammells mentioned in the Vetrun of December 1984, the previous big events were the 1979 World Veterans Championships in Hannover, Germany which attracted 3,126 competitors and the 2nd European Veterans Championships, in Brighton, England with 3,050 entrants. The Los Angeles Olympics attracted just under 2,000 competitors.

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The largest age group is M40 with 962 entries, 50 entrants are over 80, six are over 90 and two, both from India - are over 95.

One problem arises from the need to accommodate the large numbers of runners in each event. For example there are 134 entrants for the 10km event, almost double any previous world games entry, and yet it had been hoped to run this in cool, evening hours. With such numbers this may not now be possible and some categories of runners in this event may have to compete for it early on the second day. This is typical of the logistical problems the organisers face in this huge event.

Maggie Webb (W35) emerged as clear winner of this handicap event and thus shares the Carr|Shand trophy with Kevin Martin (M50) who led the men to the finish. This event took place in beautiful conditions and because it was set slightly early in the year the heat was not really a problem. Most competitors stayed on to enjoy the warm hospitality of Jean and Dennis Wilmott and we thank them and their helpers for organising this deservedly very popular event on our programme.
