PERTH MARATHON 1987 - RICHARD HARRIS WRITES:-

The West Australian Vets threw their weight behind the W.A. Marathon Club's Perth People's Marathon last month by nominating the event as the veteran's marathon championship.


As a result there was a strong turn out of veterans who were good ambassadors for the sport, generally finishing strongly and maintaining good form.

The first veteran home was John Pressley (M40) who was seventh overall in 2:37:49 - his third marathon this year. The second veteran was David Muir (M40) overall tenth in 2:44:02 and the third, Viv Bryant (M41) overall 26th in 2:49:02.

The first woman, who was also first veteran woman, was Janice Collins (W40) who finished in 3:13:16 and Trisha Spain (W45) was overall 5th woman and second veteran in 3:38:39.

Mention must also be made of veterans Graham McDonald (M45) 2:51:13, John Millane (M45) 2:53:15, Geoffrey Steed (M40) 2:54:48, Jim Barnes (M40) 2:56:18, Tommy Watson (M53) 2:56:31, Barry O'Brien (M45) 2:56:34, Graham Thornton (M45) 2:57:39, Morris Warren (M45) 3:29:08, Kathleen Noordyk (W40) 3:43:17, Eddie Strickland (M65) 3:38:02, Duncan Strachan(M65) 4:01:53.

The runners battled as buffeting head wind over the last 14 km and rising temperatures put pressure on those needing more than three hours to finish.

History of Fairbridge

Kingsley Fairbridge was born in Grahamstown, South Africa in 1885 and moved with his family to Rhodesia in 1896. In 1903, aged 17 during a visit to his grandmother in England, he was struck by the sight of poor children in the streets and the waste of their lives in workhouses and orphanages. He then set out to realize what he called his 'vision splendid':-

"I saw great Colleges of Agriculture (not work houses) springing up in every man-hungry corner of the Empire. I saw children shedding the bondage of bitter circumstances and stretching their legs and minds amid the thousand interests of the farm. I saw waste turned to providence, the waste of unneeded humanity converted to the husbandry of unpeopled acres." After many viscissitudes Fairbridge inaugurated the "The Child Emigration Society"in October 1909. (This was later to become the Fairbridge Society).

In 1912 Kingsley Fairbridge and his wife, Ruby, established the first Fairbridge Farm School at Pinjarra and received into his care the first 13 children from the Mother Country. Thus began the great work of Fairbridge which, in the years ahead, was to provide a new life with a future bright with promise not only for many hundreds of children, but for their own children in turn.

In spite of the difficulties of two World Wars and the untimely death of Kingsley Fairbridge in 1924 at the age of 39, the work he started was maintained and extended by the Fairbridge Society which established other Farm Schools and smaller centres.

With the passing of the <u>Children Act of 1948</u> the lot of 'deprived' children in England was <u>improved</u> and the need for the kind of help that Fairbridge offered, changed. Nevertheless, the Society established the Kingsley Fairbridge Scholarships awarded annually to young people from England studying for their first degrees at Universities in Australia and Canada.

Thus Fairbridge's 'Vision Splendid' was brought to reality.

Meanwhile Fairbridge Village at Pinjarra was leased to any group willing to use it and maintain it to benefit underprivileged young people. The Jesus people ran it from July 1983 to December 1984, after which no other suitable lessee was available. The Fairbridge Board therefore began using the village as a holiday village, keeping prices to a minimum to enable people, particularly youth groups, to enjoy a holiday at an affordable rate. The money so generated is ploughed back to enable the buildings to be restored and up-graded.
